

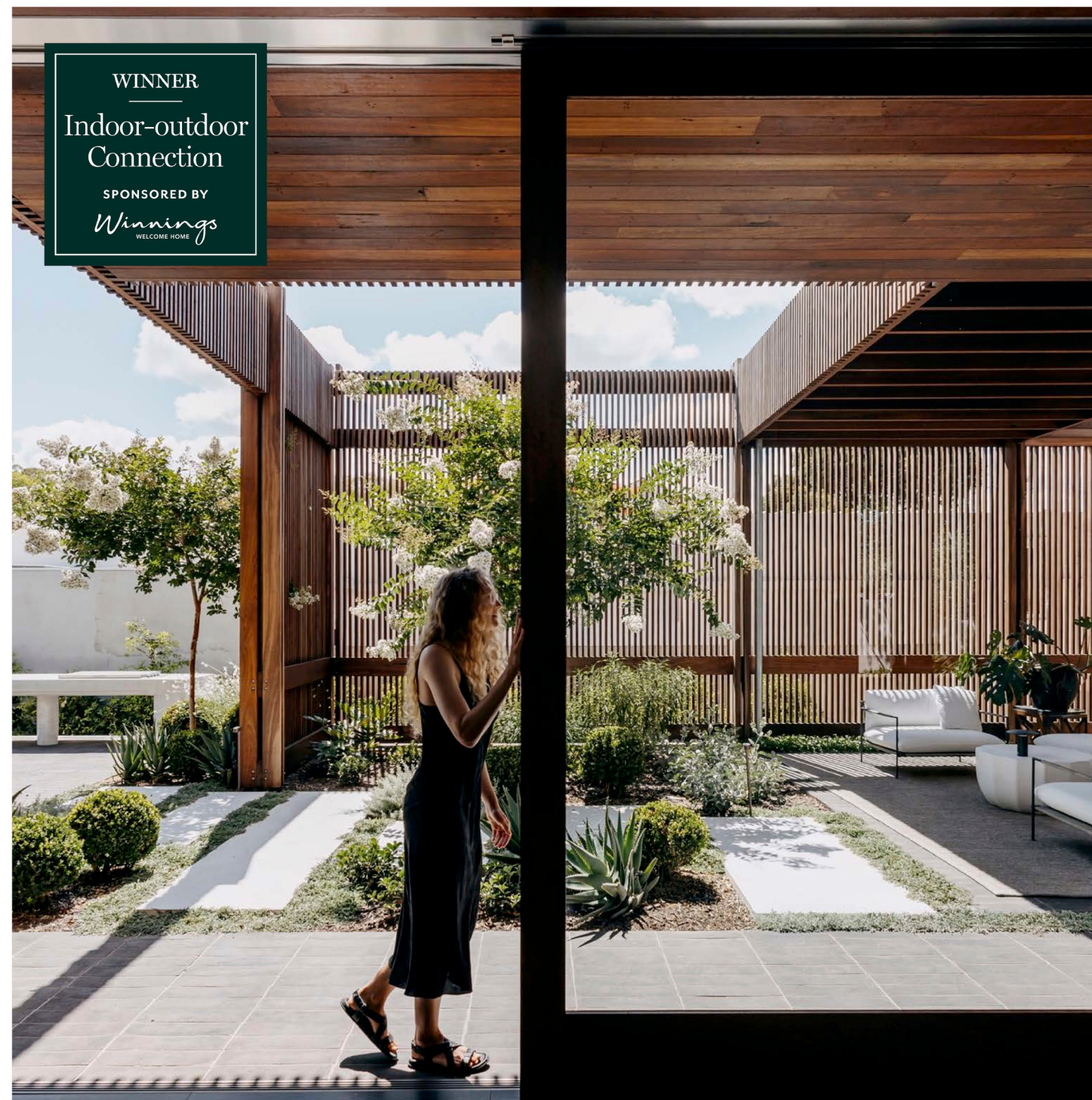
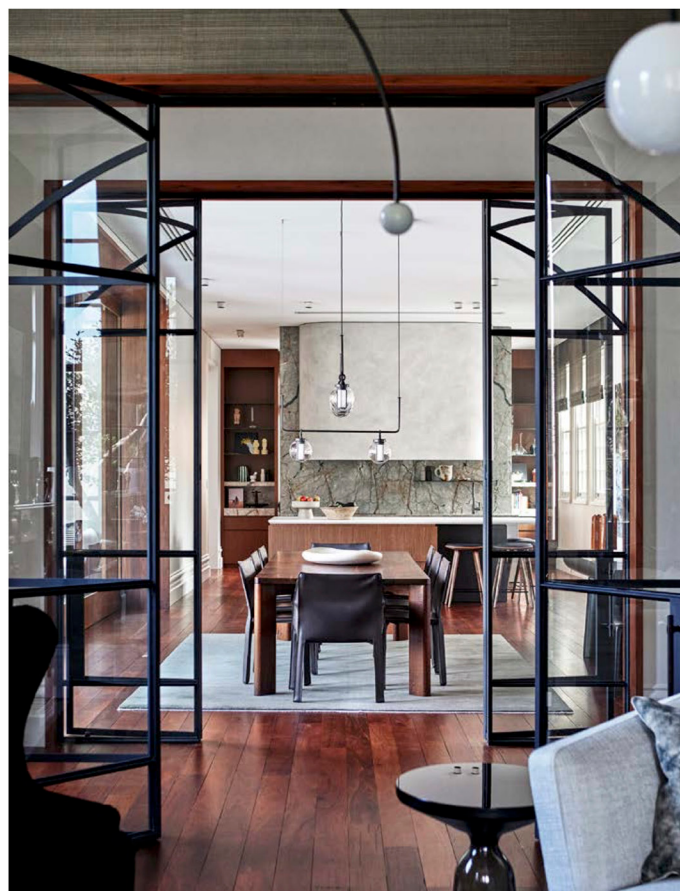

Following years of neglect, a historic home in Perth has undergone a much-needed transformation at the hands of Hare + Klein and Spaceagency. In order to reinvigorate the exterior, a massive concrete addition was demolished and a new exterior courtyard designed in its place. Floor-to-ceiling glass sliding doors open to a Japanese cherry blossom tree, and a slatted timber frame brings definition, privacy and shade to the area.
