Loads of character was top of the brief for this bathroom, which also serves as a guest cloakroom and provides access to a steam room. Cristina Repeti of design studio Hare + Klein was thrilled to take on the job. The rural home's design was based on the aesthetic of an agricultural shed, with simple lines and a restrained palette. This minimalist style was carried through to the bathroom, where concrete floors, stone and microcement form the base. Unglazed Japanese terracotta mosaics and handmade terracotta wall lights reflect the colours of the raw earth that surrounds the property.
